Contemporary Latin American Cinema



This series looks at fourteen films made from the early 1980s through the present day. What role does cinema have to play in confronting legacies of military regimes; difficult questions around poverty, migration and narcotrafficking; debates over emerging racial and sexual identities; and aspirations for a just and prosperous future in a region historically bereft of one?


