From January 2 through February 4, the Gene Siskel Film Center presents *Cinema Suzuki: Branded to Thrill,* a tenfilm retrospective of Japanese director Seijun Suzuki, long a controversial figure in his native Japan, and with a growing cult reputation worldwide. A master of the widescreen format, Suzuki worked largely in the gangster genre. Laboring for years as a relatively anonymous director of "B" pictures and violent action films for Nikkatsu Studio, Suzuki honed a colorful and iconoclastic style that mixed pop culture, gangster lore, and sex with cynicism and black humor.

The titles alone suggest colorful and lurid tales: BRANDED TO KILL, YOUTH OF THE BEAST, TOKYO DRIFTER, GATE OF FLESH, and PISTOL OPERA. See these films and more throughout January.

The traveling Suzuki retrospective is programmed by Tom Vick, Curator of Film, Freer and Sackler Galleries, Smithsonian Institution, and co-organized with the Japan Foundation.
