In Haynes' revelatory and unsettling drama, Carol White (an exceptional Julianne Moore) is an aimless Los Angeles housewife suddenly struck by a mysterious, debilitating illness. When her condition can't be diagnosed, her isolation deepens.

QUEEN KELLY (1929)

1929, dir. Erich von Stroheim, USA, 105 min.

A decadent late-silent masterpiece, Erich von Stroheim's epic unfinished swan song pulls no punches in this story of a prince (Walter Byron), the orphan girl he falls in love with (Gloria Swanson), and the mad queen whose jealousy wreaks havoc on everyone involved. (NYFF)

BATCH '81 (1982)

1982, dir. Mike De Leon, Philippines, 100 min.
In Tagalog with English subtitles / Format: **4K digital restoration**

Freshman Sid Lucero (Mark Gil, in his breakout performance), desperately wants to join the Alpha Kappa Omega fraternity. Over the course of a gruelling initiation process, he goes through every humiliation to please his "masters" — even as their treatment veers into increasingly fascistic, cult-like territory. IN THE WINK OF AN EYE (KISAPMATA) (1981)

1981, dir. Mike De Leon, Philippines, 98 min.
In Tagalog with English subtitles / Format: **4K digital restoration**

One Sunday in November, Mila (Charo Santos) announces to her father Dadang (Vic Silayan), a retired police officer, that she is pregnant, asking for permission to marry her co-worker Noel (Jay Ilangan). The couple marries and soon, Mila's father begins a game of exclusion and manipulation in the hopes of reasserting control over his kin. (Kani)

CONVERSATION PIECE (GRUPPO DI FAMIGLIA IN UN INTERNO) (1974)

1974, dir. Luchino Visconti, Italy, France, 121 min.
In English / Format: **4K digital restoration**

A retired professor (Burt Lancaster) lives alone in a luxurious Rome apartment, withdrawn from the world and accompanied only by his art. His seemingly peaceful existence is shattered when he's convinced to rent out space to a group of young lodgers. (Kino Lorber)



OPENS FEBRUARY 20
THE RAZOR'S EDGE (GHAZL EL-BANAT) (1985)

1985, Jocelyne Saab, France, Lebanon, 102 min.
In Arabic and French with English subtitles / Format: **4k digital restoration**

Directed by war correspondent-turned-filmmaker Jocelyne Saab, this fiction feature debut set amid the Lebanese Civil War follows the unlikely bond formed between Karim, a forty-something painter, and Samar, a teenager from war-torn Beirut.

Some combinations of scene and sound are so striking they become irrevocably linked in our cultural memory. Well-timed tunes punctuate the edit, trigger strong emotions, and communicate unspoken stakes. Classical music with its sweeping instrumentation shines in many iconic movies and is a joy to experience in the cinema among a rapt audience.

In collaboration with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, who mounts a live presentation of Stanley Kubrick's *2001: A SPACE ODYSSEY* with a full orchestra and choir accompaniment on January 9 and 10, the Siskel Film Center presents our favorite films featuring indelible classical music cues.

THE LOVERS ON THE BRIDGE

1991, dir. Leos Carax, France, 126 min.

In French with English subtitles / Format: **4K digital restoration**

Carax's vivid tale charts a volatile romance between a sight-impaired artist (Juliette Binoche) and an alcoholic performer (Denis Lavant) on the Pont-Neuf, erupting in ecstatic style and confirming the director's daring vision within post-New Wave French cinema. (Janus) Features Zoltán Kodály's *Sonate Pour Violoncelle Seul: Opus 8*.

BADLANDS

1973, dir. Terrence Malick, USA, 95 min. In English / Format: Digital

Terrence Malick's *BADLANDS* follows Kit (Martin Sheen) and Holly (Sissy Spacek), young lovers who flee South Dakota after killing her disapproving

father, drifting toward the Montana badlands while committing coolly detached, seemingly random murders. Inspired by the Starkweather-Fugate case, the film's unsensational, judgment-free gaze makes it a haunting American masterwork. (Warner Bros.) Features Erik Satie's *3 Morceaux en forme de poire*.

(Michelle Pfeiffer). Director Martin Scorsese's lush adaptation charts a doomed love constrained by social expectation, revealing the beauty and quiet ache beneath Gilded Age propriety. (Sony Pictures) Features Felix Mendelssohn's *String Quintet No. 2 in B-Flat Major, Op. 87: III. Adagio e lento*

TALES OF THE FOUR SEASONS

1990–1998, dir. Eric Rohmer, France, 447 min.

In French with English subtitles / Format: Digital

Start the new year by experiencing four seasons in a day with back-to-back screenings of Eric Rohmer's perennially delightful quartet. Cinema's expert of romance, each film in Rohmer's tetralogy follows different relationships, chronicling their ups and downs, misunderstandings and disappointments, and all matters and rhythms of the heart. Program includes three intermissions.



SATURDAY, JANUARY 10, 11:00AM
BATANG WEST SIDE

2001, dir. Lav Diaz, Philippines, USA, 315 min. In English and Filipino and Tagalog with English subtitles / Format: 2K digital restoration

It is a cold and cruel winter in Jersey City, and police detective Mijares is investigating the murder of a teen who got caught up in the dealing of a street drug called shabu. As Mijares pounds the pavement collecting clues, a portrait of alienated immigrant Filipino youth—marked by gangs and drug use—emerges. SATURDAY, JANUARY 17, 9:00AM
PARK LANES

2015, dir. Kevin Jerome Everson, USA, 480 min. In English / Format: Digital

PARK LANES clocks in at eight hours, the run time of the average American work day, observing the daily grind of workers at a factory that produces bowling-alley equipment. Unbroken sequences observe workers on the line, their acts of assemblage transforming into a choreographed dance. From its title to its run time, *PARK LANES* demands reflection: on labor, on class, on endurance, on perseverance. Program includes no intermissions (as intended by the filmmaker).

EIGHT DEADLY SHOTS

1972, dir. Mikko Niskanen, Finland, 316 min.

In Finnish with English subtitles / Format: Digital

Director Mikko Niskanen delivers a shattering performance as the farmer Pasi, who struggles to support his family and self-medicates with alcohol. Originally made for Finnish television, Niskanen's film is a monumental vision on the big screen, a story that seems small and inconsequential but unfolds as an epic portrait of desperation and rage. WAR AND PEACE

1965, dir. Sergey Bondarchuk, Soviet Union, 453 min. In Russian, German and French with English subtitles / Format: **4K digital restoration**

Bondarchuk's *WAR AND PEACE*, rarely shown in its entirety, is the definitive adaptation of Leo Tolstoy's epic classic. A sweeping vision that set a new standard for epic moviemaking, the film is best appreciated with a comprehensive viewing, wherein the romance of the text is brought to breathtaking life. Program includes three intermissions.



This film series explores 65 years of African cinema, from anti-colonial resistance to digital reinvention. Through 14 films from across the continent, African filmmakers reimagine the medium as a tool for decolonization, self-representation, and artistic innovation, connecting the political with the poetic. This pioneering work—the first feature by a sub-Saharan African director—uses stark cinematography and the haunting presence of an African mask to examine racial exploitation and the false promises of colonial modernity.

HYENAS

1992, dir. Djibril Diop Mambéty, Senegal, 110 min.
 In Wolof with English subtitles / Format: Digital

Mambéty adapts Dürrenmatt's 1956 play, *The Visit*, into a satirical allegory about Africa's relationship with global capitalism, structural adjustment, and moral compromise. The film's theatrical style and bitter humor expose how economic desperation transforms community solidarity into collective complicity.

COME BACK, AFRICA

1959, dir. Lionel Rogosin, South Africa, USA, 83 min.
 In English / Format: Digital

Shot clandestinely as a "commercial travelogue" to evade apartheid authorities, Rogosin's docufiction follows Zachariah, a Black South African who leaves rural KwaZulu-Natal for Johannesburg's gold mines. Through Zachariah's experiences, Rogosin exposes apartheid's systematic violence.

SAMBIZANGA

1972, dir. Sarah Maldoror, Angola, France, 97 min.
 In Lingala and Portuguese with English subtitles / Format: Digital

Set in 1961 during Angola's liberation struggle, the film follows Maria as she searches for her husband Domingos, a construction worker arrested by Portuguese colonial police for revolutionary activities. This landmark of militant Third Cinema demonstrates women's central role in liberation movements.
